8 Sail Brewery has produced RAF Cranwell Centenary 1915-2015.


Hafod Brewery is celebrating the Daniel Owen Festival with bottled Daniel Owen, 1836 to 1895.

Yorkshire Drinks Company is producing Blue Steel Nuclear Ale, supporting Vulcan XH558, and another bottled beer called Vulcan Bomber. Unfortunately their web site doesn't give any further details.

Arkells did Wessex Volunteer to commemorate 100 years of the Territorial Army.

Havant Brewery did 'Finished' which was their last brew. I understand it is still available from <u>various outlets</u>.

Lincolnshire Brewing Co produce bespoke ales, among which was a bottle for Thorpe Camp



Tring Brewery produced Bison Duathlon for the event on Dunstable Downs on 8th October 2016. **Bewdley Brewery** did Flying Hopsman for the Flying Scotsman's visit to Severn Valley Railway. **Black Sheep** has done a limited edition Imperial Russian Stout at 8.5%. This follows on from the first version

they did in 2011.

Kirkstall Brewery have brewed a special Ivatt Ruby Ale in aid of the Ivatt Appeal for the Keighley and Worth Valley Railway. This is available on draught.

NATIONAL BREWERIANA AUCTION

The National Breweriana Auction, held at Burton Town Hall on 22nd October, produced some excellent items. For once most reserves were set realistically, so many of the items were sold, at healthy prices. I have included a list of lots and prices realised with this newsletter.
