Since the last issue of Beer Memorabilia, I have been asked to outline some background to the Association. So here goes.

The Association for British Brewery Collectables started life as the Association of Bottled Beer Collectors, in 1983. It became evident that both members and non members alike wanted an organisation that represented the interests of all breweriana collectors, not just bottled beer collectors. So the Association became the Association for British Brewery Collectables, with the proviso that anything covered by other breweriana organisations should be referred to them, so as not to encroach on their territory.

Since then, in common with some other organisations, the Association for British Brewery Collectables found that attendance at meetings was declining, and so were membership numbers. The crunch came when our excellent newsletter editor had to resign for personal reasons.

It was then decided that in order to serve members and our hobby better, we would become an internet-only organisation. We could then redesign our newsletter to fit in with the new format, and hopefully become a stronger organisation as a result. Thus the Association for British Brewery Collectables was re-shaped to become what it is now. We offer a newsletter and a web site. We also have occasional meetings, and we have one lined up in Bristol in May next year, which is listed elsewhere in 'Beer Memorabilia'.

Innis and Gunn does regular limited edition beers which members may find collectable. These can be found on their web site.

Moor Brewery has had its range of canned beers approved by CAMRA as real ale. An interesting set of collectables for can collectors.

Meantime Brewery are now producing Thomas Hardy's Ale. There is an excellent article on the background to this on <u>Jeff Evan's website</u>. In the 2016 International Wine and Spirits Competition it won a 4 star beer description in the 'ale' category. Note the new version has a crown cap, not a cork.



Huge price paid for US beer bottle label? A Gunther & Co. Milwaukee Export beer label may have fetched \$4,258.00 in an E-bay auction in the USA. That roughly equates to £3,510.00 at the time of writing. However, the item was 'relisted', and subsequently sold for \$536.88 (£442.00). Either the original sale fell through, or there were two of them! Have a look at the original listing, if it hasn't been removed, and decide for yourself.
