

ADNAMS


Fourpure Brewery has done The Raspberry Special, available on draught or in can.

Roosters has done Highway 51 in can.

Marble Brewery has bottled Lost your Marbles, a fruit infused, red wine barrel aged Russian Stout.

Sadlers has done 1886 in cask for Kidderminster Harriers, for sale exclusively in the Harriers Arms.

Weird Beard Brewery has done Mesca Uladh, brewed by five Northern Irish people under the collaborative label of Ulster Exiles. The beer is for sale in Northern Ireland.



Norfolk Brewhouse has done a cask ale, Chevallier Gold for Norwich City of Ale.

Poppyland Brewery has done Back from the Dead for Norwich City of Ale, in bottle.

Farr Brewery has launched Chief Jester on draught, a beer in memory of a departed friend of the brewers. Ten per cent of the proceeds will be donated to the Rennie Grove Hospice in St Albans.

Arran Brewery is to release limited edition cans of 'ab', i.e., Arran Blonde. **Hall and Woodhouse** has done the first in a series of limited edition craft beers celebrating the American craft beer scene, entitled 'Badger; an American venture'. The beer is in bottle and is available from Waitrose and Ocado.

St. Austell has brewed a celebration pale ale in cask and in bottle to celebrate five years of their brewing beer for Nicholson's.

Hook Norton has done a limited-edition cask beer called 812 to commemorate a World War 2 bomber crashing in Oxfordshire.

Albion Brewing Co. has bottled Akela, a reference to the Jungle Book. It is a limited-edition beer intended exclusively for Wolf Wine, a stall at Bath's Green Park Station market. However, demand has dictated that it be sold further afield.

Brewdog has rebrewed and bottled the first three beers they ever produced. These are in a 3-pack called Original Trilogy, which consists of Original Punk IPA, The Physics red ale and Hop Rocker lager, all in their original livery! They are available through their web site, for £5.50.

Wadworth has done a pair of 'sporty' beers, Dirty Rucker and Dirty Chucker, referring to Rugby and Cricket respectively. These are both on draught.

Hog's Back has done a limited edition Honeyed Ale in bottle called Summertime Buzz.

Thornbridge Brewery has done Godiva for Beer Day Britain. There is no information on how this beer is to be presented.







Poppyland Brewery prints this advice for label collectors on its web site;

"My printer Steve Ratcliffe up the street on Holt Road (Cheverton and Son) uses a self-adhesive paper called 'Communique'. If you try to soak off the label in water you will find that the paper disintegrates and the adhesive doesn't dissolve. The technique is to keep the label dry but very slowly and carefully fill the bottle with very hot or near boiling water, shaking to ensure that the heat is dissipated to avoid thermal shock and breakage. You will then find that you can peel one corner up and by slowly and steadily pulling at it the whole label will gradually come off, with some of the adhesive on the back and some still on the bottle.

I only print as many labels as I need plus a few more for the archive. They are a significant part of the costs of producing the beer. If you do want some, please send a cheque for £5 (the lowest retail price of a bottle of my beer) to my address and I will send a selection of the currently available ones: Chesterfield Lodge, West Street, Cromer, Norfolk, NR27 9DT".

Asda is to add lots of craft beers to its range from May 24th.

Election beers. Around most elections some breweries produce election beers. I haven't heard of any yet, but expect a small crop of them imminently.


AUCTIONS



A sample pack of eight different coronation crown caps was sold on E-bay for £54.55. The Armstrong Cork Company produced these caps for use on special beers produced for the coronation, in place of any brewery's own caps. A high percentage of breweries adopted these, which could be in any of eight colours. The caps now sell to collectors for up to £5.00 each. The premium price would be for the pack itself, which is extremely interesting, in that it indicates how the uniform coronation caps must have been adopted by breweries based on seeing these samples. The colour cap that breweries used usually matched the bottle label.

3 Butler's of Wolverhampton signs went for a very reasonable price of £60.00 the set of three plus fees at William George & Co Ltd., Peterborough this weekend. Someone got a bargain!







Some crown caps sold very well on E-bay recently.










The Courage cap sold for £41.00, The James Deuchar cap and the McMullen's cap sold for £42.00 each, and the Dog's Head Guinness cap sold for £79.78, all in unused condition.

A Showerings Light Bitter label sold on E-bay for £71.60. Showerings stopped brewing in 1952, concentrating instead on soft drinks and the likes of Babycham and cider. They were located in Shepton Mallet in Somerset. The label was described as being in excellent condition, and unused and unmounted.



This **Offilers' Shelley (Wileman) jug** went for £361.00 on E-bay. With a couple of chips on the spout, it still sold for a healthy price. Offilers' Brewery is very sought after. This jug dates to between 1911 and 1923, and bears the mark 'Late Foley' as used by Wileman & Co., between





An Eady and Dulleys of Market Harborough Bitter Ale stoneware jug sold on E-bay for £137.00. The brewery was taken over by Northampton Brewery in 1929, so this jug has some age to it. The jug was described as in good condition, and had a manufacturer's base mark, Price of Bristol.



A pub token from the Odd Fellows Arms, Bury sold on E-bay for £74.50. The face value of the token was 2d. Pub tokens were produced as currency in specific pubs. Even scarcer than pub tokens were brewery tokens which were paid to brewery workers in lieu of pay, and redeemed for beer in a pub belonging to the brewery. An alternative type of brewery token was to pay for barm, or yeast, usually for making bread in the home.
