


MY HOLS!

BREWERIANA NEWS

Holler Boys Brewery is commemorating the Beast of Bevendean, a local mythical big cat, with a draught beer called 'the Bevy Beast', for a pub called The Bevy, a community owned pub in Brighton.




Adnams has done 'Jack Brand Flat White Porter' in bottle and mini-keg. This is the latest addition to their Jack Brand range. Jack Brand is Adnams oldest trade mark, which was reintroduced in 2013 for their limited-edition beers in bottle or mini-keg.



Miaow!

St. Austell is continuing with its draught [Small Batch Brews](#). Notable examples are 'Black Square' Imperial Russian Stout, 'Twenty 20', which is a celebration of 20 years at the brewery for a brewer, and 'Cornish Tiergarten', which is a Berliner Weisse. Black Square was originally a collaboration with New Riga's brewery of Moscow. I've never had a bad drink of St. Austell beer in the last 10 years. But as far as I know their small batch beers can't be sampled further north than Bristol, which is a shame. Incidentally, their limited-edition Advent calendar is available to pre-order from [their web site](#) at £65.00 for 24 items.



Wylam Brewery and Hawkshead Brewery have collaborated to produce 'Pleasures in the Darkness', an 11% imperial stout in cask.

Bishop Nick Brewery has these [limited-edition beers](#) available at present in bottle or cask. 'Witch Hunt', 'Goldstaff', 'Revelry', 'Dark Mild', and 'Dark Times'.

Bad Co. Brewery has produced several beers for the Edinburgh based on-line beer store, Flavourly. These include the canned beers 'Pillow Fight', 'Electric Boogaloo', 'Endless River', and 'Flamingo Juice'. These names were dreamt up by competitors in an on-line competition to name the beers. The winners will receive a case of the beer they have named.



Vocation Brewery has done 'Search and Rescue' on draught. Incidentally, they regularly produce 'Chop & Change' in cask. This is a single hopped beer, with a different type of hop used every brew. However, I don't think they do a special pump clip for each.

Wadworth has done 'Treacle Treat' for Halloween, in cask and in bottle.

Wold Top Brewery has done 'Worts n' Ale' in cask.



Cheshire Brewhouse has done 'We're All Mad Here' in bottle, as part of their 12-bar blues series. No, I don't understand the connection, either.



Treens Brewery has done 'Ruby IPA' on draught.

Thornbridge and Wild Beer have collaborated to produce 'Wild Tart' in bottle. Being in Bakewell that is probably the origin of half of the name of this beer.

Ridgeside Brewery has done 'Wubbalubbadubdub' on draught in very limited quantities.

Brinkburn St. Brewery has bottled '150 Years Anniversary Blonde Ale' for the 150th Anniversary of Tyne Theatre and Opera House.



Fourpure Brewery has redesigned its cans. More collectables for can collectors.

First Chop Brewery has bottled Salford Pale Ale for the 13th Salford Foodie Festival. All First Chop beers are named just by their initials. This one is 'SPA'.

Timothy Taylor has brewed a cask beer to celebrate the 150th Anniversary of the Keighley and Worth Valley Railway. It will only be available at the attraction's festival which runs from October 19th to 22nd.



Llangollen Brewery is brewing 'Ambrosia Ale' on draught, exclusively for the Llangollen Food Festival.

Fat Cat Brewery has done a special cask charity beer called 'Cats' Eyes' for the centenary of Dipple and Conway, opticians in Diss. 14,500 pints were done.

Stoney Ford Brew Co. has done 'Stamford 50 Commemoration Ale' on draught for the 50th anniversary of Stamford town.

Rudgate Brewery has done 'Going for Gold' on draught for Shed Seven pop group. It is available in Nicholson's pubs, and should be available on the band's tour.

Black Tor Brewery has done Jester Gold on draught, made with green hops.

Woodforde's has brewed a limited edition bottled beer for the Porkstock Festival, raising money for [Nelson's Journey](#) charity called, 'Porkie's Bitter'. They have also produced a limited edition run of 500 bottles of 'Once Bittern Bitter' for Halloween.

Lacon's has done 'Phantom' in cask for Halloween.

Bootleg Brewing Co. has done 'Chorlton Green Hop' in cask, made with hops from the roof of the brewpub. Bootleg is owned by Joseph Holt's.

Wild Beer Co has released the 2017 version of 'Brett Brett' Double IPA in bottle.

Hog's Back has bottled 'Farnham White', a golden ale brewed with their own hops. It's available on-line from the brewery at £16.34 for 8 bottles.

Eden Brewery are producing 'Rebel Rebel' in a 750ml bottle, reminiscent of a Mick Jagger, David Bowie creation. They are also doing 'Juniper Wit', a wheat beer, surely reminiscent of gin.

Neepsend Brew Co. has done 'Double Century IPA', on draught, their 200th brew.

Abbeydale has done 'Don't go Bacon my Heart', a bacon and ice cream stout. I do wonder sometimes whether you can call products like this 'beer'.

Stancill Brewery has done 'Wichita' on draught.

Steel City Brewery is producing 'Demons Are Back' on draught. Two special versions will be created, the first will be for Steel City Beer Festival and named 'Some Men Just Want to Watch the World Burn', featuring chillies. The second will be aged in a white wine barrel with grapes and dry hops, and available later in the year. Also later in the year will be 'Scraping the Barrel', a rum-barrel aged version of Mayhem stout, and an as-yet-unnamed red wine barrel-aged version.

Moonshine Brewery has produced 'Regenerator' in bottle and on draught in aid of stem cell research.

Wychwood has bottled a Halloween beer which it is referring to as an unofficial Halloween beer.

Shepherd Neame is confirmed as bottling a Christmas Ale this year.

Ridgeway Brewery has done 'Bad Elf' (again, twice), as well as 11 others in bottle.

Cheshire Brewhouse has bottled '2 Ure Gud Elf'.

Palmer's has relabelled Tally Ho as Tally Ho Ho Ho.

Windsor & Eton Brewery will be doing 'Mandarin Christmas Ale' on draught and in bottle. At the launch at the brewery on 24th November a special 'Grand Marnier Mandarin Ale' will be on offer.



Piddle Brewery is bottling Stocking Filler again this Christmas and is doing 'Winter's t' Ale' on draught.

Wychwood is doing Bah Humbug in bottle.

An unnamed brewery has done Skids Olympian Beer for the pop band's tour. As far as I can tell it's in cans.

Beer Adventures is a new, free mobile phone app that has been launched to take beer tourists around Manchester, Liverpool, parts of London and several other cities. It's part of the growing popularity of beer tourism, which is now a major attraction in Manchester and Liverpool, and in many other parts of the UK. No doubt versions will be produced for other places, hopefully facilitating breweriana collectors in their quest for memorabilia. The Manchester tours currently include a guided 2-mile beer tour around bars like Port Street Beer House and The Pilcrow, and a 3-mile brewtap tour around the city centre breweries that open their doors at the weekend, including Cloudwater's Barrel Store and Runaway's taproom.

QVC is doing a best of British Beer 6 Piece Christmas Beer Selection. This costs £19.96 reduced from £22.50 which is still over three quid a bottle. You can have a laugh at the movie of the presenters selling the stuff on [their web site](#). Watch when they pour some bottled conditioned beer as fast as they can, and it comes out cloudy. The 'selection' contains Frosted Hop, Baa Humbug, Bauble, the ubiquitous Cheddleton Christmas Ale, Bobbin' Robin and Tinsel Toes. I'm not sure whether all these beers are from this year's issues. Presumably they are. But here are the presumed brewers of these beers. Frosted Hop comes from Stonehouse Brewery, Baa Humbug has been done by several breweries, so I have no idea which is represented here, Box Steam Brewery has already been reported as doing Bauble. Cheddleton Christmas Ale and Bobbin' Robin have been produced by Staffordshire Brewery and Woodfordes has previously produced Tinsel Toes.



Thomas Hardy's Ale, 2017 has been released in the USA for the first time. It won't be released this side of the Atlantic for a few more weeks. I understand, however, that there is no UK distributor, they are all in Europe. Thomas Hardy's Ale is brewed by Meantime Brewery, but the brand is Italian owned. Incidentally, 2018 is the 50th anniversary of Thomas Hardy's Ale, and is expected to give rise to a special edition.

Jeff Sechiari, Chair of the Brewery History Society has collaborated with others, including members of Isle of Wight CAMRA, to produce a series of booklets describing historic walks around the Isle of Wight. There are five at present, and they include a range of pubs and breweries, both surviving and defunct. These are available to download as a pdf from the web page iwbeerandbuses.co.uk/walks.php. Each booklet is about 8 pages long,

with the emphasis on pubs, and including bygone breweries. These featured in the Isle of Wight Beer and Buses weekend, from 14th to 15th October, but will be available long after that.

Brewdog has announced this year's 'Collabfest', where staff from its bars team up with individual breweries to produce a one-off beer. These are Aberdeen & [Fierce Beer](#), Birmingham & [Burning Soul](#), Brighton & [Brighton Bier](#), Bristol & [Lost and Grounded](#), Camden & [Brewheadz](#), Cardiff & [Crafty Devil](#), Castlegate & [Speyside Craft Brewery](#), Clapham & [Gipsy Hill](#), Clerkenwell & [Siren Craft Brew](#), DogHouse Merchant City & [Up Front](#), Dundee & [71 Brewing](#), Edinburgh & [Stewart Brewing](#), Glasgow & [Fyne Ales](#) & [Out of Town](#), Leeds & [Ridgeside](#), Leicester & [Framework](#), Liverpool & [Black Lodge](#), Manchester & [Track Brewing](#), Newcastle & [Almasty](#), Norwich & [DEYA Brewing](#), North Street Leeds & [Northern Monk](#), Nottingham & [Black Iris](#), Oxford & [Lovibonds](#), Sheffield & [Abbeydale](#), Shepherd's Bush & [Weird Beard](#), Shoreditch & [Affinity Brew Co](#), Soho & [Redchurch](#), Southampton & [Unity](#), Stirling & [Fallen](#) and York & [Brew York](#). Foreign Brewdog bars are teamed up with foreign craft breweries. The beers are to appear in Brewdog bars from 20th to 22nd October.

Grapefruit beers have recently started to make an appearance. If you're on Statins, watch out! Avoid.

Advent calendars. You may have wondered why I haven't listed many Advent calendars this year. It's because breweries or retailers don't say what's in them. You'll usually get cheap, and even out of date beer so some sellers can reduce their stocks. Rarely will you get limited edition beers.

These **crown caps** sold well on E-bay recently.





The slight rust markings on the Bullards cap must have held it back a bit. Otherwise all four caps are in excellent condition. The Bass, Ratcliff and Gretton cap is one I've never seen before, but I have included it as the beer originated in the UK. Crown caps often had a cork disc on the inside to form a gas-tight seal. The seller pointed out that none of these had any trace of cork.



This Brown & Co., Shakespeare Brewery cask label, circular in shape, sold on E-bay for £59.00. The brewery was in Redditch, and was taken over by Ind Coope in 1915. The label had a few faults, but no more than you would expect for something which is over 100 years old. The edge was rather ragged, and there was a small tear in the centre and some thinning. The staining on the label is evident from the image. A very desirable label, because not much has survived from Brown & Co., least of all the brewery building itself. Also, even with the slight damage, it's quite an attractive label.



This Backhouse bottler's Guinness label sold on E-bay for £103.50. I know little about this bottler, except that it bottled for a considerable period, and that it is now defunct. It bottled whisky and beer. Dundalk is in the Irish Republic. I would not normally cover Irish breweriana, as we, by name, cover British stuff. But Guinness is very popular among breweriana collectors, and deserves coverage here.




NOTES AND QUERIES

The item included with the last issue of Beer Memorabilia on Victoria Jubilee beers has brought considerable response. One member has said "I often wonder why I've not seen any commemorative bottles for the 1902 Coronation". In fact, several were done, but all are rare. According to the list compiled by Richard Lilley, the ones we know about are;

Bass King's Ale doesn't count because it didn't actually commemorate the coronation, it was mashed by the Prince of Wales before he became king.

E-Bay Item: Rare Bentley & Shaw Lockwood Brewery ½ gallon copper jug c1841 -1890. Bentley & Shaw was a Huddersfield brewery. A member has asked "*I was considering whether or not to have a go for a Bentley & Shaw copper jug on E-bay, but was a little wary as there were no bids so far. It looks genuine and I've not seen it before. Any idea on its rarity and value?*"

A very interesting jug. I suspect it's genuine, and rare, in fact possibly unique. However, the date the seller gives is way out. It can't be earlier than 1911, because the Government stamp on the base clearly says 'GR', which is either George V or George VI, which means that it could be any time between 1911 and 1952. If it was as old as the seller claims, the stamp would say 'VR' for Victoria. The stamp is genuine, number 51 was issued by Yorkshire Weights and Measures (later West Yorkshire). As the brewery was acquired by Hammonds in 1944 the jug must be earlier than that.



If you look at the lettering on the front of the jug, some of the letters are uneven, indicating that at least these letters were individually stamped (not engraved as the seller claims). This points to the probability that not many of these jugs were done, as individual letter stamping involves a disproportionate amount of work, and doesn't lend itself to mass production. If a large number of jugs were done, then they would have constructed dies to stamp the whole thing at once, as they seem to have done with the words 'Bentley & Shaw'. That particular die would probably have been used for other purposes - perhaps for stamping internally used items in the brewery. It is just possible that this jug was for internal brewery use. The use of copper might suggest that, although the government stamp would suggest its use for sale.


The jug is in poor condition. It has had considerable use. However, I have never seen one before, so it is

definitely rare. £50 was a good starting price. It is not possible to value it precisely, because I have never seen one sold before. If two people wanted it enough, it could sell for as much as £300. The jug must be pretty large, as it holds four pints.

The jug eventually sold for £92.00 to the member who originally asked the question.

Eric Doré requests information about E Robins & Son Ltd of Hove.

ABBC member Eric Doré is writing a short history of E Robins, Anchor Brewery of Hove and is seeking any information, photos, details regarding the location of company records etc that members might have. Fortunately, this appears to be one of the breweries which was visited by Alfred Barnard but, sadly, escaped the attention of researchers, Lesley Richmond & Alison Turton.

The brewery was started by Ebenezer Robins in Brighton in 1789. One researcher says that Ebenezer was a member of an "impoverished Jewish family" living in Hove but if that is the case, the source of the information has not come to light, nor has any detail concerning the source of original finance for the brewery. Does anyone have information?

The last set of beer labels showed an imp as a trademark or logo but the thinking behind this is not clear. Unless you know otherwise! Also, one of the last bottle labels was for a Royal Pale Ale but whether this celebrated a Royal event is also not clear. Does anyone know?

Eric has information from Andrew Cunningham who has a bottle of the last brew at Waterloo Street, Hove with a date of 30th January 1924 shown on the label. The brewery had moved to Brighton from Hove by 1831. But the company did not dispose of assets until 1928. What happened in the meantime?
