



## BREWERIANA NEWS



**Castle Rock** has rebranded their 'Elsie Mo' beer in response to the general criticisms of sexism in beer names. A previous example is shown to the left, while the revised version is shown to the right. Look out for other rebrandings in the industry, which will be especially relevant to pump clip collectors, as sexism is rife in the cask beer industry.



**Arkell's** has celebrated its 175th anniversary with a beer which the Duchess of Cornwall had a hand in, by swinging the valentine, a device which controls the flow of wort. The beer is called 'the Duchess Ale' and will be available from the brewery around the second week of February at £1.90 per bottle. The significance of the middle of February and its Valentine connection hasn't escaped me, and I would prefer to call it 'Swigging the Valentine', as a means of celebrating the day in question!

**Bude Brewery** has done 'Adult Wrestling' for Valentine's Day in cask.

**North Brewing Co.** has celebrated the 20th anniversary of its pubs with a draught beer called 'North Bar #NB20'.

**Robinsons** has done yet another Iron Maiden beer called 'Light Brigade'. The cask beer is produced in aid of Help the Heroes.

**Fullers** has done 'Front Row' in cask to commemorate the Six Nations. Incidentally, their 2017 Vintage Ale has recently been

seen in Waitrose. If you're still trying to get hold of one, it's worth trying your local Waitrose. Their price for Prize Old Ale on Fullers web site is now an eye-watering £10.00 a bottle.




**St. Austell** has done 'Cousin Jack' in time for the Six Nations. Raising money with Jack Nowell, Cornwall's Rugby Union star, yet again for the RNLI they're hoping to beat last year's total of £6,350.00 for the charity.

**Jennings** has produced a revised, limited edition pump clip for its Cumberland Ale, to commemorate its 190th anniversary. Incidentally, look out for other items of breweriana celebrating their anniversary during 2018.

**Adnams** is doing a limited-edition keg beer called 'Cucumelon Sour'. Also, their 'Oyster' cask beer will be around during March.


**Burnside Brewery** has done 'Celtic Beast' on draught for a local rock band of the same name.





**This Henty & Constable showcard** sold on E-bay for £114.55. There's not a lot of Henty & Constable stuff around. I am surprised that this item went for such a high price. However, this is probably a very rare item. It is almost certainly post-war, but fairly soon after the war, because of its plain design. The brewery was taken over by Watney's in 1954, so it should date to before then. It is not particularly attractive, so its attraction must be its condition which was described as being very good, and its rarity.



**A pair of this brass Dale's item** sold on E-bay for £117.00. Unfortunately, I'm not sure what it is. The seller suggested they were 'advert disks' for beer bottles. I don't think that's very likely. He also suggested they were blinkers for horses. I don't think that's likely either, however, they may well have been advertising badges for horse brasses, although they are a bit small for that. I am advised also that they could have been studs on a horse's bridle. They were described as 65mm wide, which is just over 2½ inches. It's possible they are unusually large buttons for Draymen's overalls, but I prefer the horsey theory. Dale & Co. Ltd., of Cambridge was founded in 1898 and taken over by Whitbread in 1954. (The seller's claim that they dated back to the late 1800s was therefore unlikely). Does anybody know for sure what they are?



**Two Flyers from Allsopp's Brewery** sold for over £100 each on E-bay. The India Pale Ale flyer sold for £133.00 while the Lager one sold for £102.00. The Lager one was double sided with a list of stockists, while I understand the other one was single sided. The India Pale Ale item was described as 'not mint', and seemed to have a vertical fold down the middle, while the other one was folded horizontally. The lager one had 'May 1889' written in pen on it, and that date is quite possible for both items. They are particularly attractive because they have a facsimile label on them, which certainly adds to their desirability. Not many items like these are seen – flyers of any age don't tend to survive, which makes these items scarce.

**This Worthington Jardinière** sold at auction at Hutchinson Scott Auctioneers of Skipton for £150.00. The item is a rare Minton's advertising piece from the early part of the 20th century. It looks a bit tired, being discoloured, and parts of the design are faded. I suspect that is a result of being used in an outside location such as a beer garden. Nonetheless it is a desirable item.

### NOTES AND QUERIES

**Guinness clock.** A member writes, when I was small I used to sit and watch the Guinness Festival clock in Battersea Park, it was a true spectacle. Having said that being about 5 or 6 at the time the three fishes eating each other used to worry me no end. Has anyone ever tried to restore one? Do parts still exist? What a feature it would make at, say, a major beer festival!

**I also remember the Guinness clock** in Battersea. My grandmother used to take me to Battersea at the tender age of five, just to see the Festival of Britain clock. All the Guinness clocks were scrapped in the late 1960s. There's a smaller copy of one in Guinness' Dublin Museum (or there was one last time I was there, which was some time ago.) Editor.

**A member writes;** The last issue of Beer Memorabilia, No.46, with the Heavitree label brought back memories. I always remember being told that the Heavitree cask beers were so bad that they couldn't wait for the arrival of Whitbread 'Trophy' to make its appearance in Heavitree pubs in the 70s - there was even a queue that extended outside the pub the day it was launched. People tend to forget that all was not well in the world of real ale in the past, a case of rose tinted glasses perhaps...

**You say that Heavitree beers were bad.** In fact, so were Devenish. When I was young (I'm not saying how old), we used to go into Devenish pubs in the Exeter area, where the beer was consistently awful, so we always drank keg. I think it's down to the lack of landlord training back in those days. Editor.

**Colin West** is seeking information on Snell and Raven of the Hope Brewery, Wethersfield, Essex, often referred to as the Wethersfield Brewery.

The brewery was in production from 1852 until 1901, when Greene King bought the company but sold the production facility back to the family (keeping the 15 pubs). Brewing probably continued for some years longer. The brewery was converted into domestic accommodation in 1950.

**Eric Doré** requests information about E Robins & Son Ltd of Hove.

ABBC member Eric Doré is writing a short history of E Robins, Anchor Brewery of Hove and is seeking any information, photos, details regarding the location of company records etc that members might have. Fortunately, this appears to be one of the breweries which was visited by Alfred Barnard but, sadly, escaped the attention of researchers, Lesley Richmond & Alison Turton.

The brewery was started by Ebenezer Robins in Brighton in 1789. One researcher says that Ebenezer was a member of an “impoverished Jewish family” living in Hove but if that is the case, the source of the information has not come to light, nor has any detail concerning the source of original finance for the brewery. Does anyone have information?

The last set of beer labels showed an imp as a trademark or logo but the thinking behind this is not clear. Unless you know otherwise! Also, one of the last bottle labels was for a Royal Pale Ale but whether this celebrated a Royal event is also not clear. Does anyone know?

Eric has information from Andrew Cunningham who has a bottle of the last brew at Waterloo Street, Hove with a date of 30th January 1924 shown on the label. The brewery had moved to Brighton from Hove by 1831. But the company did not dispose of assets until 1928. What happened in the meantime?


