




BREWERIANA NEWS

Northern Monk, Verdant & Deya have collaborated to produce 'Hop City IPA' in can. **Brewhouse and Kitchen** breweries in Dorset commemorated International Women's Day on March 8th with a FemAle brewery experience day, where women were invited to participate in brewing a limited-edition beer to celebrate the event. The breweries involved were those in Dorchester, Poole and Southbourne. Beers produced by Brewhouse and Kitchen are almost exclusively on draught.

St. Austell has announced the first series of small batch beers for 2018. These are 'Enter the Dragon' in collaboration with Bath Ales, as well as 'Diablo' and 'Adriatic'. All are expected to be available on draught, but some may also be bottled.



Wiper and True has done a beer for International Women's Day, called 'XX', a Gooseberry Wheat Beer, on draught and in bottle, brewed by the women in their team.

Adnams is busy at present, producing 'Arabella SB' (a collaboration with Harpoon Brewery in the US) and 'Fat Sprat' (includes a donation to the Marine Conservation Society) in cask and 'New England IPA' and 'Bicycle Kick' in keg.

Fourpurre Brewery has done 'Easy Peeler' on draught and in can, as part of their Adventurer series.





Pressure Drop Brewery is hosting a women's collaborative project between themselves, brewer Jenn Merrick and Herriot Watt students. The as yet unnamed beer will be available on draught and in bottles or cans. Jenn will be launching Earth Station Brewery in London later this year.


Truman's Brewery, in addition to their regular beers, will be doing frequent limited-edition cask beers, among which will be re-creations of former Truman's beers. Their latest limited edition is 'Gypsy Queen', an oatmeal Pale Ale available in cask. The pump clip is designed by a local artist. I was quite partial to a 'Ben' myself, in the olden days. I wonder if they'll resurrect that.

Six Degrees North Brewery has done 'Buddha' in bottle for a Japanese restaurant.

Bath Brewhouse was reported in the last issue as producing an unnamed fudge beer. Rumours are rife that it is to be called 'Fudgeweiser'. I hope not!

Nutbrook Brewery was used by a retired brewer to produce a charity beer called '1918' in cask and in bottle, to commemorate the centenary of the end of World War I. It will be on sale at the Chip and Pin in Melbourne, Derbyshire.

Farr Brew is to brew a special bottled beer to support Herts and



Middlesex Wildlife Trust. The Trust is organising a competition to name the beer. The winner will receive 12 bottles of the brew itself. The closing date is March 31st.

Carlsberg has re-created its original dark lager recipe from 1883 and has released it to the UK market. It is expected to be available until June.




Abbeydale's limited edition cask beers available now are 'Soundtrack', 'Waltzer' and 'Dr. Morton's Morton Caesar'.

Chiltern Brewery has done 'Pride of Bucks and Berks', a charity beer on draught.

Wye Valley is doing 'Gøddess' in cask. Also watch out for 'Malt Teaser' in April, also in cask.



Orbit Beers has done 'Rauch Pils' and 'Mandarina', both in keg. Their output seems to be mainly limited-edition beers, although they do seem to have four rather esoteric regular brews. Their point of sale material, some of which is downloadable from [their web site](#), seems to be exclusively black and white, hence the name, White Label Series.



Black Sheep Brewery is continuing its Monty Python theme with 'Flying Circus' on draught.

Stockton Brewing Co. is bottling 'Buffalo Soldier', a Cannabis IPA. I've no idea how they get away with it, but good luck to them.

New Lion Brewery has bottled DIBS, which stands for Devon Independent Bottle Shops. It was produced for Tucker's Maltings bottle shop, but may be found in other Devon beer retailers in case you have difficulty finding Tucker's Maltings open.

Drygate Brewery has bottled 'Orpheus Imperial Stout'.

Wild Beer's latest offering is 'Breakfast of Champignons, 2018', in bottle.

Bradford Brewery has agreed to celebrate the local paper, the Telegraph and Argus', 150th anniversary with an as yet untitled beer. As is often the case with unnamed beers, the newspaper is organising a competition to name the beer. 40 nine-gallon casks will be done.

Siren has bottled two-barrel aged beers, 'Barrel Aged Shattered Dream' and 'Summer Encore'.

Black Sheep Brewery has been named as the official brewery for the Tour de Yorkshire, 2018. Presumably there will be a beer or three to commemorate the event, as well as other breweriana.

Fullers and Friends is to return in 2018 and 2019.

Harbour Brewing Co. is opening a new brewery specialising in small batch beers. This is planned to open in April.

Wylam Brewery is hosting collaborations between themselves and Buxton Brewery, Cloudwater, Black Lodge, Northern Monk, Magic Rock, Hawkshead, Thornbridge and Box Social. The project is entitled the Northern Powerhouse Brew Series, and will run in conjunction with the Great Exhibition of the North at the Palace of Arts (where Wylam resides) in Newcastle upon Tyne. The beers will be available in 440ml cans. 6,600 cases containing all eight beers will be made available.



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Manchester is to host a competition between breweries representing cities in the UK. The cities and breweries involved will collaborate in producing a beer for each city (Manchester is entering two teams); Manchester team 1 consists of Cloudwater, Track, Runaway and Wander Beyond. Manchester team 2 consists of J.W. Lees, Marble, Beatnikz Republic and Pomona Island. Bristol team consists of Lost and Grounded, Left Handed Giant and Moor Beer. Leeds team consists of North Brewing Co., Northern Monk, Kirkstall and Zapato. Liverpool team consists of Mad Hatter, Chapter, Neptune and Top Rope. London team consists of Fourpure, Beavertown, Brew by Numbers and Orbit. Each team will create a one-off collaboration beer, and these will be put to a public vote during the first weekend of Manchester Beer Week, June 29th. Events will also be held at the same time in the other participating cities where drinkers will be able to vote.


AUCTIONS



A Guinness 'pocket watch style' roulette wheel (left) sold on E-bay for £311.00. Ordinary Guinness pocket watches, if genuine, sell for around £300.00. This is a working roulette wheel inside a pocket watch case, and is considerably rarer than Guinness pocket watches. According to David Hughes' 'Guide to Guinness collectables', 5,000 of these items were made for overseas distribution in 1929, making it much earlier than Guinness pocket watches. This item had a facsimile Guinness label on the back, (right) which was considerably worn. Also, the case had some damage in places.



The Guide to Guinness Collectables, in pre-proof form, before it was sent to the printer's, by David Hughes, sold on E-bay for £122.00. The copy was signed by the author(s). The seller writes "This is the first version done in Word of the full book before it went to the publisher, on A5 pages 210 x 150mm. It has a black plastic ring binder spine and is printed in matt finish. This is a unique version as the original book is out of print and sells for about £75 on eBay". Apart from having the potential to fill a gap in a Guinness collector's book collection, if the collector hasn't got the original volume, this is a collectable item in its own right. It contains about 1,200 pictures of Guinness collectables. Volume 2 of this title is due for publication soon, and is advertised elsewhere in this newsletter. Don't miss it!



A G & J Maclachlan match holder and striker sold on E-bay for £231.00. This item seemed to be in excellent, unused condition. It was marked on the base as Wm Brownlie Ltd., of James Street, Glasgow, a lithographer and showcard manufacturer. Maclachlan had two breweries, one in Edinburgh and one in Glasgow. The Glasgow brewery was closed when the Edinburgh one was opened. The company was registered as G & J Maclachlan Ltd., the form of name on the match striker, in 1907, and re-registered as Maclachlan's Ltd., in 1923. This indicates that the item dates to between 1907 and 1923. The brewery was closed in 1966, after Tennent's had taken them over in 1960, and was subsequently demolished. Match strikers are always popular items, and this one is both rare and attractive.

WATCH OUT




Don't get caught out by items like this framed Bass advert on the left. It's a fairly common Bass advertising sign which has been doctored by an unscrupulous person in the hope of making it more desirable, and therefore more expensive. I understand it has been doing the rounds of fairs over the past few months at an asking price of £300.00. An original, un-doctored item would normally sell for £100.00 to £200.00 depending on condition. Unfortunately, instead of making the item more valuable, this person has rendered the item worthless, except for curiosity value, and has ruined a nice piece of breweriana.

Also, watch out for e-mails, What's App messages, etc., giving away free Heineken beer in celebration of their 140th anniversary. It's a scam. Have a look at [Heineken's web site](#) (the genuine thing!) for more information – but don't click on any link unless you're sure it's genuine.

BOOKS



Voices of Guinness; an oral history of Park Royal Brewery, by Tim Strangleman, author of 'Work and Society'. Oxford University Press, due out in September 2018. ISBN10 0190645091 and ISBN13 9780190645090. £22.99. 352p. An oral history of one of the most collectable breweries, and also one of the most written about, which is now sadly shut. It tells the story of work in the twentieth and early twenty-first century through one plant - the former Guinness brewery at Park Royal, West London. It reflects on questions of industrial citizenship, work meaning, identity, loss, deindustrialisation, and change through powerful oral histories with a wealth of archival and photographic materials.



HELP WANTED


This section offers you the opportunity to request information and help from Association for British Brewery Collectables members. It will be useful to people looking for substantial information, for example when compiling books or journal articles.

Colin West is seeking information on Snell and Raven of the Hope Brewery, Wethersfield, Essex, often referred to as the Wethersfield Brewery.

The brewery was in production from 1852 until 1901, when Greene King bought the company but sold the production facility back to the family (keeping the 15 pubs). Brewing probably continued for some years longer. The brewery was converted into domestic accommodation in 1950.

Eric Doré requests information about E Robins & Son Ltd of Hove.



ABBC member Eric Doré is writing a short history of E Robins, Anchor Brewery of Hove and is seeking any information, photos, details regarding the location of company records etc that members might have.

Fortunately, this appears to be one of the breweries which was visited by Alfred Barnard but, sadly, escaped the attention of researchers, Lesley Richmond & Alison Turton.



The brewery was started by Ebenezer Robins in Brighton in 1789. One researcher says that Ebenezer was a member of an “impoverished Jewish family” living in Hove but if that is the case, the source of the information has not come to light, nor has any detail concerning the source of original finance for the brewery. Does anyone have information?

The last set of beer labels showed an imp as a trademark or logo but the thinking behind this is not clear. Unless you know otherwise! Also, one of the last bottle labels was for a Royal Pale Ale but whether this celebrated a Royal event is also not clear. Does anyone know?

Eric has information from Andrew Cunningham who has a bottle of the last brew at Waterloo Street, Hove with a date of 30th January 1924 shown on the label. The brewery had moved to Brighton from Hove by 1831. But the company did not dispose of assets until 1928. What happened in the meantime?




