

## BREWERIANA NEWS


**DE14** has done Marmalade IPA. It will be available on draught in five to ten pubs in or near Burton on Trent.



**Siren Craft Brew** has produced draught beers to commemorate its fifth birthday. The two beers which are exclusively UK based are 'Maiden 2017' and 'Limoncello IPA'. In addition, they have done 'Caribbean Chocolate Cake' in collaboration with an American brewery. Recent bottlings include 'Long Forgotten Journey' and 'Barrel Aged Näckén'. Näckén is a water spirit which lures people to a watery grave. (I didn't know that either – I looked it up!)

**Lytham Brewery** has done 'Crofty's Pale Ale' in cask for a Lancashire cricketer, Steven Croft, who has a testimonial year this year.

**Derby Brewing Co.** has done 'Beast from the Yeast' in cask, with both fined and unfined choices available. Some of the profits will be donated to the East Midlands Ambulance Service.



**Calvors Brewery** has done 'Co-Hop Beer' to commemorate the 150th anniversary of the East of England Co-operative Society.

**Robinsons** is doing 'Hoppy Wan Kenobi' in cask which will be on the bar in June and July.

**Northern Monk** has brewed a special beer for an exhibition at Temple Newsam House, Leeds called a History of Brewing and Drinking. The beer, called 'Temple Newsam Beer', is in keg and in can, and made to a 1736 recipe.

**Mobberley Brewhouse** is bottling 'Batch 1,000' to celebrate their 1,000th brew.

**Adnams** has bottled 'Both Barrels', an oak-aged version of Broadside with added cherries in a flip top bottle.

**Hawkshead Brewery** has been busy. They have done two draught beers, 'Here She Gose' and 'Imperial Flump King'. Here She Gose belatedly commemorates International Womens' Day.

**Loddon Brewery** has done 'Gorgeous George' for St. George's Day on draught.



**Fullers Vintage Ale 2017** was available in Waitrose last time I was in. If you're still looking for one, now's your chance.

## An exhibition worth seeing.




**Beer: A history of brewing and drinking at Temple Newsam.** 24 March - 28 October 2018. Temple Newsam House, near Leeds, LS15 0AE. *“Britain’s first national drink will be the focus of a new exhibition at Temple Newsam House, Leeds. At a time when drinking water was often contaminated, beer offered a safe and nutritious alternative enjoyed across all social scales. It was even used to treat a range of ailments and diseases, from jaundice to ‘the King’s Evil’. The exhibition reveals life on Temple Newsam Estate through the eyes of the staff and aristocrats who lived, worked, brewed and drank here. New stories have been uncovered from the estate archives, including that of female brewer Elizabeth Pease, who provided ale for the estate for over 30 years during the 18th century. Visitors will have the chance to see objects from Leeds’ important collection of ceramics and view areas of the house in a new light. Now a popular area on tours, back in 1869 the cellars were liberally stocked with 3,800 gallons of ale and 2,200 of beer.”* [Leeds City Council](#).

**Thornbridge Brewery** is again organising its Peakender Beer Festival in 2018, where we are told there will be plenty of one-off beers including collaborations. It is to be held on 17th to 19th August 2019 in Bakewell at the Showground. A number of different breweries will be represented.



**Everards** has introduced a clothing range, including sweatshirts and t-shirts.

## Richard Percival’s brewery tray website is back on line



After being hacked, Association for British Brewery Collectables member Richard Percival’s web site was off line for a considerable time. He has now managed to get it back on line. It looks as good as it was before it was hacked. [Take a look](#).


The site deals with Richard’s collection of brewery trays, which is probably the best listing of UK trays in the world, with each item photographed. It also shows many go-withs, and other items he collects. If you want to know about brewery trays, this is the place to look. His collection is also strong on Salt’s items, as well as a good range of ceramic coasters or siphon stands, and similar items. All pieces in his collection are photographed. It would

also be worth getting the DVD of his collection, which is produced by a fellow brewertana collector. It’s frequently available on E-bay for a starting bid of £1.99. Search the Brewertana category for ‘1500 trays’.

## AUCTIONS



**A Guinness lamp shade** sold on E-bay for £205.00. The seller stated “An opportunity to purchase a rare/reproduction Guinness lamp shade. This was made, as far as aware, as a one-off for the Guinness Collectors Club in approximately 1991/2. The shade is unused and still in its original cellophane type wrapping. The shade has all the animals, associated with Guinness, around its base. It is believed that the shade would have sat on the Guinness Toucan on a bar in a public house.” As Editor, I am not aware of one of these having been produced. If the seller’s claim that it was made for the Guinness Collectors’ Club is true, then I am surprised that there is no indication on the item to indicate that it is reproduction. Original Guinness lamp shades are in short supply, as they deteriorate more quickly than the rest of a Guinness lamp. Collectors would certainly jump at the chance to replace their shade in poor condition with a good one. That would account for the price of this example.



**This Offilers’ jug** sold on E-bay for £178.00. This is quite a rare jug, and a very attractive one, being in the Art Deco style, and dating back to the 1920s or 1930s. It is manufactured by T. G. Green of Church Gresley. Offilers’ is a very sought-after brewery, and apart from labels and jugs, there’s not a huge amount of other stuff available. Offilers’ was based in Derby, and brewed from 1876 to 1966, when it was taken over by Charrington United Brewery. It is a well-regarded brewery in Derby, and although I only sampled its beer once, I still remember it to this day as an excellent pint.

**The Good Beer Guide for 1974**, the first edition, sold on E-bay for £72.00. This edition is quite sought after now, far more than later issues. There were two versions of this publication. The seller didn’t state which one this was. The first version, writing from memory, was complained about by Watney’s. The description ‘avoid like the plague’ against Watney’s entry, was objected to. CAMRA, instead of fighting their corner, caved in, and brought out a revised version which said ‘avoid at all costs’. This was, in fact, not the first issue of the Good Beer Guide, although it is generally regarded as such. CAMRA had previously brought out a typescript publication in November 1972, which was, in fact, the original edition, which didn’t cover Scotland. It was produced when CAMRA still called themselves the Campaign for the Revitalisation of Ale. The Good Beer Guide has since gone on to be the foremost pub guide in the country, directing users to what can generally be regarded as the pubs selling the best beer. Each edition also lists all breweries, and all the real ales they produce. So a complete back-run of these is a valuable historical resource. I refer to mine frequently when compiling this newsletter.



**This crown cap, (left)** from a Bass bottler in Peterborough, sold on E-bay for £105.00. We don’t see many UK crown caps on E-bay achieving more than £100.00, and when it happens you can be sure that the item is something special. Two others, the Hammerton cap, and the King & Barnes cap (right) both sold for around the £50.00 mark.



**This Bass slate sign** sold on E-bay for £215.68. These used to hang outside the entrance to pubs, advertising the beer available in the pub. They are well sought after. This one was in good condition. The seller described it as rare. In fact, it's not particularly rare. There was another one on E-bay at the same time, selling at a buy-it-now price of £225.00. They crop up fairly frequently, although some are missing the glass cover that all versions originally had. There were several variations of this sign. This one had an enamel insert depicting a facsimile of a bottle label, and is particularly desirable. Others were more plain, many advertising Draught Bass. These slate signs can still sometimes be found hanging outside former Bass pubs.



**The R. W. Miller & Co.** enamel sign shown above sold at East Bristol Auctions for £940.00 plus fees, which amount to about another 21%, making almost £1,140.00 altogether. The brewery was in production in Bristol from 1893 to 1911, when Bristol Brewery Georges took it over. Despite the rusty condition of this item, it sold OK. Enamel sign collectors don't worry too much about the condition. This sort of condition is acceptable to most collectors. Enamel signs end up like this because of the British weather and vandalism. And an item this rare can be expected to be extremely popular among collectors. I have never seen anything from R. W. Miller, although I suspect that labels and bottles will exist.



**This Guinness showcard** harks back to the days when Guinness was two bob a pint or a shilling a glass (half pint), which I suspect is the late 50s or early 60s. It sold on E-bay for £170.00, in good condition apart from some water staining. It has its stand intact on the back as well as a cord for hanging it if that method of display was preferred. The item measures 10 inches by 5 inches and is numbered GA2450.



**This Unusual Barnsley Brewery clock** with the name Oakwell Brewery around the face sold at auction at Dee, Atkinson and Harrison of Driffield for just £55.00. An extra 20% was added on for buyer's premium and VAT, making £66.00 in total. I wonder if the brewery used 'Oakwell' rather than 'Barnsley' on the clock because the number of letters fitted better around the face. If genuine, this is a lovely novel item which would look good in anyone's collection. The cask isn't one which would have held beer, it is a decorative one. You can tell that from the spile, which is not of the sort brewers would use, surrounded by a heavy brass barrel bush to take all the punishment that a publican would mete out when venting the cask.

## NOTES AND QUERIES

A member has contacted 'Beer Memorabilia' concerning a 1968 Thomas Hardy's Ale with a D prefix. The bottle is an empty pint with the number D 010, and dated July 1968. As far as I know D prefix bottles were issued in 1974, which was the first batch after 1968. All 1968 bottles I have come across have either an A, B or C prefix. Has any member come across any other 1968 D prefix bottles?

## HELP WANTED



**Colin West** is seeking information on Snell and Raven of the Hope Brewery, Wethersfield, Essex, often referred to as the Wethersfield Brewery.

The brewery was in production from 1852 until 1901, when Greene King bought the company but sold the production facility back to the family (keeping the 15 pubs). Brewing probably continued for some years longer. The brewery was converted into domestic accommodation in 1950.

**Eric Doré** requests information about E Robins & Son Ltd of Hove.



ABBC member Eric Doré is writing a short history of E Robins, Anchor Brewery of Hove and is seeking any information, photos, details regarding the location of company records etc that members might have.

Fortunately, this appears to be one of the breweries which was visited by Alfred Barnard but, sadly, escaped the attention of researchers, Lesley Richmond & Alison Turton.

The brewery was started by Ebenezer Robins in Brighton in 1789. One researcher says that Ebenezer was a member of an "impoverished Jewish family" living in Hove but if that is the case, the source of the information has not come to light, nor has any detail concerning the source of original finance for the brewery. Does anyone have information?

The last set of beer labels showed an imp as a trademark or logo but the thinking behind this is not clear. Unless you know otherwise! Also, one of the last



bottle labels was for a Royal Pale Ale but whether this celebrated a Royal event is also not clear. Does anyone know?

Eric has information from Andrew Cunningham who has a bottle of the last brew at Waterloo Street, Hove with a date of 30th January 1924 shown on the label. The brewery had moved to Brighton from Hove by 1831. But the company did not dispose of assets until 1928. What happened in the meantime?




