

## BREWERIANA NEWS




**Wadworth** has bottled 'Suits you Sir' for the Royal Wedding. I understand the beer will also be available on draught. It has ginger in it. I wonder why!

**Adnams** are doing 'Clementine Pale Ale' in keg and 'Freewheel' in cask. Look out for 'Jasmine Tea' in cask in June.

**Hook Norton** has done 'Trial #1 Lager' as a one-off trial draught beer.

**Brass Castle Brewery** has done 'Rhubarb and Custard Light Mild' in cask.



**Ainsty Ales** has done 'Moloko Mild' in cask.


**Rudgate** has been busy with three different cask beers, 'Spring Fling', 'In Bruges' and 'Brew No. 42'.



**Hop Studio** will be doing 'Ascalon', 'Solstice' and 'Mosaic' in cask in the near future.

**Everards** has also done a beer named 'Ascalon' in cask as a limited-edition beer. I think this beer and the one from Hop Studio may be named after the sword that St. George used to kill the dragon. St. George's Day happened recently, and St George's Day beers are quite plentiful in most years.

**Bad Seed Brewery** is collaborating with Wishbone Brewery to produce an, as far as I know, unnamed Mango IPA. They have also been active on their own account, with 'Full Tilt' and 'Choc-o-Peel' in cask and 'Tidal Force' and 'Become the Legend' in keg.




**York Brewery** has brewed 'Raspberry Ripple' and 'Vic Secret' both in cask.

**Half Moon Brewery** has done 'Pour de Yorkshire' in cask for the Tour de Yorkshire.

**Harbour Brewing Co.** is brewing a draught beer called 'Market Helles' exclusively for Fulham Market Hall.

**Norfolk Brewhouse** is producing two cask beers for Norfolk day on July 27th, called 'Norfolk Day Sunset' and 'Norfolk Day Sunrise'.

**McMullen** has done 'Best of Both Worlds' for the forthcoming royal wedding, cask only.



**Farr Brew** is doing a beer for Herts and Middlesex Wildlife Trust. The inevitable competition to name the beer is over, but the winning name won't be announced until 14th May, when it will be launched to the public. It will initially be cask only but plans are afoot to bottle it from August.

**Hogs Back** has done 'Hoppy Ever After' in cask for the Royal Wedding.

**Anarchy Beer** has done 'Punk Ass' on



draught, and 'Lord Comatose' in bottle and keg.

**Four Kings Brewery** has done a draught beer for the Royal Wedding. I understand it's called 'Windsor Ale'.

**Five Alls** at Lechlade is producing its own royal wedding beer called 'Hooray Harry'. They don't say whether it's draught or bottled.

**Greene King** has done 'Harry Ever After' in cask for the royal wedding.

**Wilderness Brewery** is a new brewery set up in mid-Wales. As far as I can tell all their beers are one-offs, and all have been bottled as well as being on draught. They comprise 'Mandarina Pale', 'Abbaye Brett', 'Southern Pale', 'Motueka Grisette', 'Bière de Saison' and 'American Farmhouse'. In the pipeline are 'Kveik IPA' and 'Abbaye Dubbel'. There are quite a few Brettanomyces aged beers among their range.



**Bristol University** has produced a range of beer mats to 'make alcohol awareness more visual and creative'. I understand there are 250 versions of the mats so far, with more where they came from. This is part of a trial to see which mat designs are most effective.

**For Manchester Beer Week**, several breweries will be producing one-off beers for local restaurants. The breweries include Cloudwater, Thirst Class Ale, Runaway, Squawk, Blackjack, Alphabet, Rivington and Marble. There is an [appeal for artists to design labels and pump clips](#) for the beers. These will be displayed at an exhibition at The Whitworth Art Gallery on June 28th, and subsequently auctioned for charity.

**A Reminder - Tipplefair 2018**, a major breweriana collectors' fair, will be at the Heron Pub, Southfields Drive, Stanground, Peterborough, PE2 8QB on Sunday 3rd June, 2018. Collectors' admission, £2.00 at 11:00. Stalls £15.00. Stallholders' admission is at 10:00.



**Tetley's** revised its point of sale material, and has issued a fairly lavishly presented wooden box containing two different revised pump clips and an explanatory booklet. The pump clips in the pack I have seen are 'Original Cask' and 'Golden Ale'.




## AUCTIONS



**This superb Simonds mirror** sold on E-bay for £205.00 – a bargain. It was listed as just 8 inches by 10 inches in size. In the case of mirrors most E-bay sellers specify that buyers must collect, because of the difficulty of packing them, and finding a carrier. This wasn't the case with this mirror. This is an outstanding mirror, with images of Simonds bottled beers, including a Pale Ale and a Milk Stout. The mirror probably dates to the 1920s, and is, of course, from a brewery which was primarily based in the town in which we are holding our next meeting, Reading.

**In the meantime**, a quart sized Ind Coope Commonwealth Ale, specially brewed for the 1953 Coronation, sold for just £17.50.



**This single sided enamel pub sign** from a Kenward & Court pub called the Man of Kent, was sold on E-bay for £155.00. This sign would have been displayed on the wall of the pub, which must have been somewhere in east Kent. There are quite a few pubs called the Man of Kent, so I can't find out definitely where the pub was. Kenward & Court Brewery was in Hadlow, and the Man of Kent pub nearest to Hadlow at present is in East Peckham. I wonder if that was the pub. The brewery was taken over by Hammerton in 1945, so it is likely that the sign dates to some time before then and is almost certainly pre-war. The condition, for an enamel sign, was quite good, there being some damage, but nothing as serious as can be found on some signs that have featured here.

**This Matthews Coronation Ale label** sold on E-bay for £104.77, roughly the same as I once paid for a full bottle. This is definitely a rare label, as I had a number of label collectors contacting me about the bottle when I won it some years ago. Matthews & Co., Wyke Brewery, of Gillingham in Dorset was acquired by Hall and Woodhouse in 1963 and closed. Part of the brewery is currently lived in while the rest has been demolished. Not much breweriana survives from Matthews, although I have seen an excellent advertising poster from the brewery, now resplendent in a member's collection.



**An M. B. Foster & Son match holder/striker** sold on E-bay for £35.88. M. B. Foster bottled, exported and sold, among other beers, Bass and Guinness. They sold them under the name 'Bugle Brand'. This item dates to after 1890, when M. B. Foster & Sons was incorporated as a limited company. They merged with Probyn's in 1958 to form Foster Probyn. I suspect that the low price that this item realised is because it was originally attached to a base which served as an ashtray, and has subsequently broken away.

**The next Loddon Auctions sale** featuring beer bottle labels, will be on 13th and 14th June. I am not reporting results of these auctions because it takes ages for the results to come out, and they are readily available, eventually, on the Loddon Auctions web site.

## NOTES AND QUERIES



A Bass mirror was sold at Unique Auctions Lincoln. I have contacted several members, none of whom have seen it before. I haven't either. I have had to enhance the photograph to get rid of some distracting items and have restored the perspective. The original was even worse than my 'enhancements'. One member points out that the frame looks 1930s, and I agree with him. However, 'our finest ale' goes back to the 1980s, although it might have been used before. Has anybody seen one? Has anybody got any suggestions? It certainly doesn't look like a fake, but it sold at auction for just £40.00.


I have had some comments already;

**Scottish Brewery Trade Marks 1876-1976 Kindle Edition.** £6.99. An e-book by Edward





collectors of all manner of things, ranging from beer bottles to beer labels and all types of items and ephemera relating to brewing in Scotland. Above left is an example of an entry for John Aitchison & Co. Ltd., of Edinburgh. Beer Memorabilia has previously reported that Scottish brewery trade marks are better documented than the rest of the UK. This is the title that does that job, and does it well.

## EVENTS


### Association for British Brewery Collectables events.




