

BREWERIANA NEWS

Brewdog has released details of some forthcoming special beers. These are 'Lost Lager' in keg, 'Double A' in keg, 'Jet Trash version 2' in cans, 'Alice Porter' in keg, 'Sonic Boom v2.0' in keg, 'Haedor' and 'Rhus', both in keg and bottle, 'Electric India' in keg, 'Paradox Uncle Dukes' in bottle, 'Beatnik 2018' in keg and bottle and '#MashTag 2018' in bottle.

Dartmoor Brewery has done 'Pub2Pub Expedition IPA' in cask to commemorate the world's longest pub crawl.

Greene King is doing 'Hops in the Park' in keg for a Tom Kerridge food and drink festival.

Nethergate has done 'Golden Willow' on draught for the Leestock Music Festival and some local pubs. It was brewed by guest brewer Penny Wilby.

Siren Craft Brew has revived its 2017 Project Barista with four 2018 bottled beers. 'Capheine', 'Breakfast Shake', 'Cold Brew' and 'Affogato'. A description of 'Breakfast Shake' shows the somewhat extreme lengths craft beer goes to. The "9.5% Breakfast Shake, is an imperial wheat stout with coffee and cacao, inspired by Siren's brewer's breakfast smoothie, and is somewhat of a dunkel weiss / imperial stout hybrid. A classic German wheat beer yeast is used to offer banana notes, while Siren uses 13 speciality malts to drive rich coffee and chocolate flavours". Wow!

Marble Brewery has done 'Pynt – otherwise known as Pint' in can. Beer Memorabilia previously mentioned that Marble brewery had been reported to Trading Standards for naming their beer Pint when it wasn't sold in pint quantities. Marble has now put the beer in metric 500ml cans. Good for them!

Merlin's Micro Brewery has done 'Squiffy Duck' to raise funds for Cheshire Wildlife Trust. It is available in cask and in bottle.

Twice Brewed bottled a Royal Wedding Ale called 'Harry & Meghan'.

Innis & Gunn has canned 'Mangoes on the Run'.




Ainsty Ales has done 'Killa Kiwi' on draught.

Brass Caste Brewery has done 'Hazelnut Mild X' in cask at 10% ABV.

Bad Seed Brewery has collaborated with North Riding Brewery to produce 'Malton Murky' in keg and with Wishbone Brewery to produce 'Ministry of Mango', also in keg. They have done several one-off beers in cask, including 'Game Face', 'Rule the Roost' and 'Session IPA'

York Brewery has bottled 'Vic Secret'.

Pressure Drop Brewing was the venue for brewing an all-female brewers' collaboration beer in bottle, called 'Rhubarb; a User's Guide'.



Up Front Brewing (based at Drygate Brewery) has done three canned beers whose names are based on Moby Dick. These are 'Ishmael', 'Yojo' and 'Ahab'.



Hogs Back has been active again. They have brewed three (or possibly more) beers for sale through Moonpig. The ones I have heard about are 'Anniversary Ale', 'Hoppy Birthday' and 'Celebration Brew'. These are all being done for sale in packs of three bottles for Father's Day. The bottles can be printed with a personal message.


Fierce Beer has canned 'Fuego Feroz'.

Robinsons is canning 'One Eye'd Jack' to celebrate 180 years of brewing. They also plan to issue in future ten limited edition beers a year. In addition, they are re-branding Dizzy Blonde in response to the backlash against sexist beer promotion.

Northern Monk has canned 'Sharknado 5, Global Swarming' in partnership with the film.



The Tipplefair takes place this Sunday. It is one of two major specialist fairs where you can be sure of finding some decent brewery collectables. The map shows how to get there. It will be at the Heron Pub, Southfields Drive, Stanground, Peterborough, PE2 8QB on 3rd June, 2018. See you there.



Hall & Woodhouse has updated its branding and at the same time has reduced the ABV of some of its beers.



Burning Sky, The Kernel, Cloudwater, the Wild Beer Co and North Brewing Co. will each be participating in a project called 'the Brithop Series', designed to showcase British Hops. I understand the series, or perhaps just some of them, will launch on June 15th.

Fuller's pilot brewery tanks have now arrived. Look out for short run beers from them soon.

AUCTIONS




This extremely rare J. Nunneley siphon stand sold for £1,400.00 plus 20% VAT, making £1,680.00 in total. It was sold at Hose Rhodes Dickson (HRD) Auction Rooms, Isle of Wight. Nunneley's was a brewery located in Burton on Trent, which existed from the 1840s up to 1895. It was registered as Nunneley & Co., in 1888. I have studied the auctioneer's illustrations of this item, and I believe it is genuine. The wear on the item is commensurate with an early

date. The firm of Joseph Causton & Sons was established in London by 1863, and by 1886 had its Head Office at 9 Eastcheap EC (London) and works at SE and New Court, Carey Street WC. It had become a limited company by 1896. That fits in with the possible dates of this item. This is an extremely scarce and valuable item. Surprisingly the auctioneers' estimate was £20.00 to £30.00, - they described it as an 'old advertising plaque'.



This Bass bottle cap, bottled by Frederic Robinson, sold on E-bay for £112.00. The cap is very rare, and Robinson's brewery items are quite well sought after, which is quite unusual, especially as the brewery is still going strong. Robinson's items have become more collectable with the issue of the Trooper series of beers over the past five years. And Bass in itself is very collectable, making this item doubly desirable.

A Buckley's Brewery of Llanelli, enamel sign sold at Rogers, Jones & Co., of Cardiff, for £240.00 plus fees of 20% including VAT, making the total price £288.00. While the sign wasn't in good condition, being badly rusted around the edges. Many enamel sign collectors are prepared to accept signs in less than perfect condition, as good condition items are almost impossible to obtain. The brewery became a limited company in 1894. As the India Pale Ale illustration on the sign states 'limited', the sign must date to after 1894. The auctioneer's estimate was surprisingly low, being £60.00 to £80.00.



This Melbourne Brewery (Leeds) mirror sold on E-bay for £122.00. This mirror is in good condition, but of average quality, and almost certainly dates to the late 1950s. It was stated as being 36 inches by 26 inches including frame. The price realised is about what it is worth.



This unusual Nalder & Collyer's brewery jug sold on E-bay for £174.99. The brewery brewed in Croydon from 1848 to 1919. The jug was manufactured by Sarreguemines, a Franco-German company, who are best known for manufacturing majolica and faience. They also made some similar jugs for other breweries both in the UK and abroad. The brewery was registered in 1888 as a limited company, and as the jug uses the description 'Ltd', for the brewery, it must date to after that date. There were a few chips, particularly to the rim, which would have affected the final price. However, Nalder & Collyer's items are very hard to come by. I have seen just one other jug from the brewery.




