

**Hall & Woodhouse** have now released their Founder's Day bottle, Tanglefoot Reserve, 6% abv. They also produced this bottle with a glass in a box for Father's Day. These were to be given away in managed houses.

**Batemans** has brewed 'Skull & Hammers' in cask for July. It is slightly worryingly described as a 'Classic beer'. Also, their Salem Brew Co., has done 'Fruit and Flame' in cask. Bateman's next offering will be 'Summer Swallow' also in cask.



**Runaway Brewery** is bottling 'Imperial Brown Ale (Gyle 200)', coming soon in a limited edition of 160, 750ml bottles.

**Breweries** have collaborated for Manchester Beer Week in a 'City Clash', where breweries representing individual cities competed to see which is the best beer city. The breweries were;

**Left Handed Giant**, Lost & Grounded and Moor Beer have collaborated to produce 'Berry Lush' in keg and in bottle. These represented Bristol.

**Cloudwater**, Track, Runaway and Wander Beyond have collaborated to produce 'DDH IPA' on draught. This was one of Manchester's two teams.

**Lees Brewery**, Marble and Beer Nouveau have collaborated to produce a Porter for Manchester Beer Week. This was the other of Manchester's two teams.



**North Brewing Co**, Northern Monk, Kirkstall and Zapato have collaborated to produce 'From Leeds with Love' on draught. No prizes for guessing where this came from.

**Mad Hatter**, Chapter, Neptune, Top Rope and Gibberish Breweries have collaborated to produce 'Scouse Sour' on draught. These were representing Liverpool and were the winning team.

**Fourpore**, Beavertown, Brew by Numbers and Orbit Brewery have collaborated to produce 'London Murk' on draught. That's London, believe it or not.

**Dartmoor Brewery** has done 'No. 4' in cask as part of their Discovery Range.

**Wylam Brewery** has done 'Alfie Blonde' on draught for the City Tavern, Newcastle upon Tyne. The City Tavern is a well-known dog friendly pub, and the beer has been done in memory of Alfie, a now deceased pub dog.



**Tyne Bank Brewery** has canned 'Strawberries and Cream' for Wimbledon. Yes, it is beer, honest!

**Curious Brewery** has collaborated with Brew by Numbers to produce 'Curiouser and Curiouser; Chapter 2' in bottle.




**Great Newsome Brewery** has done 'Galli Van Ting' in cask and bottle.






**Abbeyle Brewery** has done 'Tramlines Session IPA' in keg, can, cask and bottle for Sheffield's Tramlines Festival.

**Little Giant Brewery** brewed 'George's 1816 Porter' on 10th July for the British Guild of Beer Writers. It was done in cask and in bottle and will be an 1816 recipe revived from Bristol Brewery Georges archives. Breweriana collectors may remember that in 1994 Courage revived the same recipe in bottle for a visit of the Guild to their Bristol Brewery. I understand the beer is to be exported to Dublin.



**Sharp's** has brewed 'Honza' cask lager. This is expected to be available until the end of August.

**Exmoor Ales** has done 'Apollo' in cask, which will be available until October.



**Two Tribes** has come up with a few collaboration beers. They are 'Dubbel Beta Coumarin' with Solvay Society. With Alpha Brewery they have done 'To the Bone' and a Summer Weisse. The 'Match day IPA' was done in collaboration with Copa90, a Russian brewery.

**Fallen Brewing** has canned 'Wanganui' and 'Gose Train'. They will be available in Aldi in Scotland.

**Wadworth** has done 'Game of Stones' in cask.



**Moorhouses Brewery** and Northern Whisper have collaborated to produce 'Oatmeal Pale Ale' in cask and 'Blood Orange and Pineapple IPA' in keg.

**Brick Brewery** has canned 'Gooseberry and Elderflower Sour'.

**Sadlers** has canned 'Mission Drive', a limited edition experimental beer.

**Tapstone Brewery** (Chard) has canned 'Yeovil Show Ale'. Only 60 cans were produced.

**Beer Monkey** did 'Three Monkeys' for the World Cup, in keg.

**A Brewery History Society prize event** took place recently in a garden close to the Castle pub in Wem, now a Joules Brewery tied house, which still has at its rear the historic Wem Brewery premises. Councillor Johnson wears the raffle prize of a Joules polo shirt and shows two brewery tour tickets donated by Joules. He was the raffle winner at the BHS event which was held by Wem Civic Society, when the topic was Breweries of Shropshire and Surrounding Counties. The event was fronted by Stan Platt, BHS Regional Coordinator. Stan is grateful to Paul Johnson for donating the Joules Brewery tour tickets for a competition for BHS members.

## AUCTIONS




This extremely rare West's ashtray sold on E-bay for £192.00. West's Brewery was located in Bethnal Green, London. It was taken over by Hoare & Co., in 1929. The pottery mark on the base of this ashtray is the most useful means of dating this item. The Cauldon mark was used from 1890 to 1920. This provides us with a reasonable date range. West's was registered as a limited company in 1895. As the centre logo on the ashtray bears the word 'Ltd.' it must date to after 1895. Whatever age you assign to this item, there's no doubt it's rare, and almost certainly over 100 years old. It has survived in good condition against enormous odds, to end up in a lucky collector's possession.




