BREWERIANA NEWS.

If you know of any developments relating to breweriana, please <u>let 'Beer Memorabilia' know</u>, so that your information can be shared with other members.

Fullers, on their web site, have available some items of breweriana at reasonable prices. The items I particularly noticed were London Pride and Honeydew wall signs and a Frontier waiter's tray.

New Lion Brewery has bottled Local Hero in their White Label Series. Also, watch out for their releases of Russian Imperial Stout. Their 2014 brew is their latest release, but limited amounts of different years of this beer are released periodically. They sell out quickly.

Purity has bottled Perro Tonto, a limited edition beer aged in sherry casks, at a rather meagre 6.2%, and just 5p shy of £17.00.

St. Austell has produced Mena Dhu on draught and in bottle. This is produced with six malts, and seems to be based on the M&S exclusive, bottled, 6 Malt Cornish Stout, first seen recently.

CHRISTMAS BEERS



Yes, it's still that time of year. Any Christmas beers I hear about will get a mention, as I know there are Christmas ale collectors among you. Let me know about any you come across.

Bays Brewery did Jingle ale in bottles.

Box Steam Brewery has produced Bauble in bottle and on draught, which they describe imaginatively as "beautifully engineered in Wiltshire".

Bristol Beer Factory has brewed 12 different stouts on draught or keg for Christmas.

Castle Combe Brewery has done Carols Round the Cross in bottle.

Fullers has done Wise Men on draught, with 50p a pint going to a Prostate Cancer charity.

Leighton Buzzard Brewery did Xmash. It is aged in Islay whisky barrels, and has been bottled for sale at £15.00. It is 8.5% and is in 75cl bottles.

Maldon Brewing has done Agnes Fountain, Farmer's Christmas Stout and Five Gold Rings, all on draught, Rudolph's Red and Christmas Light are bottled.

Moseley Beer Company has bottled Christmas Ale.

Potbelly Brewery has done Jingle Daze in bottle and in cask, as well as Bar Humbug and Piggy Pudding both on draught.

Robinson's has done Dizzy's Christmas Kiss on draught.


St. Austell has done a Christmas draught beer called Jolly Holly.

Staffordshire Brewery (formerly Leek Brewery) has done a big range of Christmas beers, far too many to list here.

AUCTIONS

This Flowers Keg Bitter sign sold on E-bay for £103.11. These were usually resident outside Flowers pubs before 1954, when J. W. Green took them over. Signs like these indicated which brewery's beer could be expected to be available inside the pub. This sign was showing signs of some surface blemishes, which are consistent with it having spent its life exposed to the elements. It would be unlikely for a sign like this to be found in better condition. The Flowers name continued to be used by J. W. Green, and subsequently by Whitbread when they took over the Stratford on Avon brewery in 1968 and sadly, demolished it.





This Robert Porter label fetched £132.00 on E-bay. A very attractive label, this item wasn't used as a label denoting specific beer. In fact Robert Porter didn't brew beer, they bottled for other breweries, including Bass and Guinness, as well as having beer brewed for them which they sold under their own labels. They sold beer under the 'Bulldog


Brand'. This gave rise to some excellent breweriana, including a large ceramic bulldog, of which several variations are known. There's a wealth of other

material from Robert Porter, including many different beer bottle labels, jugs, bottle openers and even playing cards.

Brewery advertising. A lot described as 'a collection of early and mid 20th century brewery advertising signs to include Tetley's, Guinness, Yates Castle Brewery, John Smith's and others'. These were estimated by the auctioneer at £30-£50. An ABBC member bid £50.00 blind for it in the hope of getting it. They sold for £800.00 plus buyer's premium and VAT (making about £1,000.00 in total)!! These seem to be mostly showcards. It just goes to show how well breweriana is selling at present.
